| [] Safety goggles and gloves |
| [] Comet or similar abrasive cleaner |
| [] Lime Away or similar stain remover |

| [] Scrub brush |
| [] Abrasive pad |
| [] 400-grit sanding sponge |
| [] Painter's tape and masking paper |
| [] Tack cloth |
| [] Caulk and caulking gun |
| [] Plastic caulk remover or razor scraper |
| [] Can opener & stir stick |
| [] Synthetic angled paintbrush or foam roller |
| [] Floor fan for ventilation |
| Preparation Steps |
| [] Remove faucet, drain, and hardware |
| [] Clean surface with Comet and scrub brush |
| [] Apply Lime Away, rinse, and dry |
| [] Remove old caulk |
| [] Sand the surface with 400-grit sponge |
| [] Rinse and dry thoroughly |
| [] Wipe with tack cloth |
| [] Mask off surrounding areas |
| Painting Steps |
| [] Ensure good ventilation |
| [] Wear respirator and safety gear |
| [] Open and stir Parts A & B separately |
| [] Mix both parts thoroughly |
| [] Apply first thin coat using brush/roller |
| [] Wait 1 hour before recoating |
| [] Apply second coat (optional third if needed) |
| [] Wait 1 hour, then remove painter's tape |
| Curing & Finishing |
| [] Let sink cure for 3 full days before use |
| [] Reapply caulk after curing |
| [] Clean only with mild soap and soft cloth |
